5 THE COURT FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

6 1. Notice of time and place of hearing has been given as required by law.

7 2. The proposed Conservatee is aware of the hearing and has chosen not to appear.

8 Holding the hearing in the absence of the proposed Conservatee is necessary to prevent harm to
9 her and/or her resources.

10 3. It is in the best interest of the Conservatee that the Temporary Conservatorship be
11 continued over the Conservatee's Estate.

12 4. It is necessary and appropriate that the Letters of Temporary Conservatorship of the
13 Estate issued to Mr. Spears and Mr. Wallet on February 1, 2008 be extended to July 31, 2008 for
14 further hearing.

15 5. The bond fixed by the Court's prior Order in the amount of \$50,000.00 for each
16 Temporary Co-Conservator is sufficient, and the Temporary Co-Conservators shall notify the
17 Court if and when it is appropriate to modify the bond amount previously set.

19 THE COURT ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

20 1. Notice of time and place of hearing has been given as required by law.

21 2. The proposed Conservatee is aware of the hearing and has chosen not to appear.

22 Holding the hearing in the absence of the proposed Conservatee is necessary to prevent harm to
23 her and/or her resources.

24 3. Letters of Temporary Conservatorship of the Estate issued to James P. Spears and
25 Andrew M. Wallet on February 1, 2008 are extended to July 31, 2008.

26 4. The Temporary Co-Conservators of the Estate are granted the following powers in
27 addition to the powers provided by law:

28 a. The Temporary Conservators shall have the power to obtain all documents and

1 records relating to the Conservatee and her assets, whether held in her name or
2 in the name of another, including but not limited to, all records currently in the
3 possession and control of the Conservatee's business manager, Howard
4 Grossman, her attorneys, and others, all contracts, information relating to credit
5 cards, bank statements, estate planning documents, receivables, and any and all
6 powers of attorney.

7 b. The Temporary Conservators shall have the power to take all actions necessary
8 to secure the Conservatee's assets, including the power to enter and take
9 possession and control of the Conservatee's residence, to remove all persons
10 from the residence and take any and all actions necessary to secure the
11 residence, including changing the locks, call on law enforcement and employ
12 security guards at the expense of the Conservatorship Estate.

13 c. The Temporary Conservators shall have the power to take all actions necessary
14 to secure the Conservatee's liquid assets, including but not limited to, the power
15 to cancel all credit cards.

16 d. The Temporary Conservators shall have the power to revoke all powers of
17 attorneys, including powers of attorney for making health care decisions and
18 managing real estate, and to terminate any and all agencies.

19 e. The Temporary Conservators shall have the power to commence and maintain
20 litigation and participate in any litigation with respect to which the Conservatee
21 is a party or has an interest, and the power to retain counsel and experts, and to
22 pay same from the Conservatorship Estate, not only as to the family law case
23 but for any other matter.

24 f. The Temporary Conservators have the power to perform any and all acts that
25 the Conservatee can perform (whether as an individual or in a representative
26 capacity) with respect to the local, state, or federal tax liabilities of the
27 Conservatee or any entity, trust or foundation in which the Conservatee acts in
28 a representative or ownership capacity (collectively referred to as "Conservatee
and related entities"), including but not limited to the power to receive and
inspect confidential tax information; receive, and endorse or cash refund
checks; sign any and all tax returns, whether income, corporate, employment,
partnership, or otherwise; execute a Form 2848; represent the Conservatee and
related entities before all taxing authorities, participate in audits; exercise the
rights of the Conservatee and related entities to protest and appeal assessments;
pay amounts due to the appropriate taxing authority; execute waivers, tax
returns, consents, closing agreements, and similar documents related to the tax
liability of the Conservatee and related entities; participate in all procedural
matters connected with the tax liability of the Conservatee and related entities;
exercise any elections that may be available to the Conservatee and related
entities under applicable state or federal tax laws or regulations; to substitute
another representative; to request disclosure of tax returns or return information
to a third party; and to perform any other acts described in California Probate
Code section 4463, except those acts that conflict with or are limited by a more

1 specific provision in this Power.

2 g. The Temporary Conservators have the power to assert the Conservatee's rights
3 in any trust established for her benefit, including but not limited to all revocable
4 inter vivos trusts established by the Conservatee as settlor or trustor, but this
5 power shall not include the power to modify, amend, or revoke any such trusts,
6 without a court order.

7 h. James P. Spears, as Temporary Co-Conservator, has the power to lease one
8 vehicle of an appropriate size for the benefit of the Conservatee.

9 5. The Court grants the Temporary Conservators the powers pursuant to Probate Code
10 Section 2590 and the following powers set forth in Probate Code Section 2591:

11 a. To contract for the conservatorship and perform outstanding contracts and
12 thereby bind the estate, including asserting or waiving confidentiality
13 agreements.

14 b. To operate at the risk of the estate a business constituting an asset of the estate.

15 c. To pay, collect, compromise, arbitrate, or otherwise adjust claims, debts, or
16 demands upon the Conservatorship Estate.

17 d. To employ attorneys, accountants, investment counsel, agents, depositaries, and
18 employees and to pay the expenses.

19 6. The Temporary Conservators have the power to prosecute civil harassment
20 restraining orders that they deem to be appropriate.

21 7. The Conservatee shall not have any contact, direct or indirect, with Osama aka Sam
22 Lutfi, including telephone calls, text messaging, or email communications.

23 8. The bond fixed by the Court's prior Order in the amount of \$50,000.00 for each
24 Co-Conservator is sufficient, and the Temporary Conservators shall notify the Court if and when it
25 is appropriate to modify the bond amount previously set.

26 9. Following the hearing on the Temporary Restraining Order against Osama aka Sam
27 Lutfi, which is set for hearing on March 17, 2008 at 1:30 p.m., the next hearing in this matter is set
for April 17, 2008 at 1:30 p.m.






